"There is a fondness that is implanted in the minds of men, and which has always been held in the highest veneration, to derive and trace down their descent from progenitors of virtuous character and heroic worth and to perpetuate in their families the memory of these ancestral honours and of royal esteem which their valour and extraordinary services had so conspicuously merited and received. And as the great respect thus shown to noble birth and ancient descent reflects so much honour on its possessors, so also are connected with it those proud emblems of armorial family history, and which tends so correctly to point out and preserve the observance of a due and requisite subordination between the several ranks and degrees of mankind." #### d'Aubigny/Fitzalan (Earls of Arundel)

The descent is from Alice Fitzalan, the daughter of Richard Fitzalan, 10th Earl of Arundel (1305-75/76) and Eleanor of Lancaster (1318-71/72). Alice married Thomas Holland, 2nd Earl of Kent (d. 1397). One of their greatgreat grandchildren was King Richard III (1452-85).






Crichton (of Sanquhar, Lords Crichton of Sanquhar from 1487/88 and Earls of Dumfries from 1663)

The descent is from of Sir Robert Crichton of Sanquhar, Dumfriesshire who died 1478-79. The descent is from two of his daughters, Elizabeth who married William Douglas of Drumlanrig, Durisdeer, Dumfriesshire and Margaret who married Sir David Herries of Terregles, Kirkcudbrightshire.



Home (of that Ilk, Lords of Home from 1473, Earls of Home from 1604/05)

The descent is from Alison Home, daughter of Alexander Home, 3rd Lord Home and Katherine Stirling. Alexander Home was executed for treason in 1516. Alison married Henry Wardlaw of Torrie (mentioned below under Wardlaw of Torrie).



# de Lacy (Lords of Meath)

The descent is from Egidia de Lacy, daughter of Walter de Lacy, Lord of Meath (d. 24 February 1240/41). She married Richard de Burgh, Lord of Connaught.



Le Bigod (Earls of Norfolk)

The descent is from Isabel le Bigod who married John fitz Geoffrey, Lord of Shere (d. 23 November 1258). Isabel was the daughter of Hugh le Bigod, 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Norfolk (and one of the witnesses to Magna Carta) and Maud Marshal, the daughter of William Marshal, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Pembroke (of the second creation, see below).



Dunbar (Earls of Dunbar and Moray)

The descent is from Margaret Dunbar (d. Bef. 13 April 1552) who married Alexander Stewart, 5th of Garlies. Margaret was the daughter of Sir Patrick Dunbar of Clugston, Kirkcowan, Wigtownshire (a 9<sup>th</sup> great grandson of William the Lion, King of Scotland). There are two descents from Margaret's grandchildren, Alexander Stewart, 6th of Garlies (d.1597) who married Christian

Douglas, and secondly, Agnes Stewart who married Sir Andrew Agnew of Lochnaw (d.1616).

There is also a descent from Sir Alexander Dunbar (d. 10 March 1497/98) of Westfield who was an illegitimate son of James Dunbar, 4th Earl of Moray (of the second creation) and Isobel Innes. Alexander Dunbar married Isobel Sutherland, daughter of Alexander Sutherland, Lord of Duffus. Alexander Dunbar was a great-great-great grandson of Thomas Randolph, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Moray (of the first creation) and used the same coat of arms (i.e. of Randolph), depicted at right. Sir James Dunbar, a descendant of Alexander Dunbar and Isobel Sutherland was created a Baronet in 1814 as Dunbar of Boath.





### Abernethy (Lord Abernethy)

The descent is from Mary Abernethy of Ballinbreich, Fifeshire (d. Bef. 19 November 1355) who married Sir David Lindsay of Crawford, Lanarkshire. Mary was the daughter of Alexander Abernethy.



# Gordon (of Lochínvar)

There are at least two descents from Gordon. Grisel Gordon of Lochinvar, Dalry, Kirkcudbrightshire married Sir Alexander Stewart, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Galloway on 16 October 1600. Another descent is through Katherine Gordon, the grandaunt of Grisel. Katherine married Patrick Agnew (d.1514) of Lochnaw, Leswalt, Wigtownshire.



Kennedy (Lords Kennedy from 1450, Earls of Cassillis from 1509 and Marquesses of Ailsa from 1831)


The descent is through Margaret Kennedy of Culzean, Kirkoswald, Ayrshire (a 6 greats granddaughter of King Robert III of Scotland), daughter of Sir Thomas Kennedy (d.1602) and Elizabeth MacGill of Cranstoun Riddel, Cranston, Midlothian. Margaret married Sir

Patrick Agnew, 1st Baronet of Lochnaw (d.1661).



#### Earls of Strathearn

There are a number of descents from this family. One descent is from Isabella of Strathearn, daughter of Malise, 8<sup>th</sup> Earl of Strathearn (d.Bef.1357). Isabella married Sir William Sinclair of Roslin (d. Aft. 13 September 1358).




Douglas (Earls of Douglas, Angus, Morton and Mar, later Earls, Marquesses and Dukes of Queensbury)

*There are many descents from Douglas.* 

There is descent from Margaret Douglas, daughter of James Douglas, 3rd Earl of Morton (d.1548) and Katherine Stewart (illegitimate daughter of James IV of Scotland).

There is descent from the Earls of Douglas through Elizabeth Douglas, daughter of Archibald Douglas, 4th Earl of Douglas and Duke of Touraine (d.1424), his arms are depicted





below at right. Elizabeth Douglas married (inter alia) William Sinclair, 3rd Earl of Orkney. There is also descent from Douglas of Drumlanrig (a line descending from William Douglas, an illegitimate son of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Douglas). Christian Douglas, a daughter of Sir James Douglas (1498-1578) married Sir Alexander Stewart, 6<sup>th</sup> of Garlies and they were the parents of Sir Alexander Galloway, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Galloway (d.1649).



The arms depicted on the previous page are from top left (clockwise), the 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Douglas, the Earls of Morton, Douglas of Drumlanrig, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Douglas, Douglas of Dalkeith and Hermiston (ancestors of the Earls of Morton) and James Douglas "the Black Douglas", father of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Douglas.



Hay (Baronets of Park from 1663)

The descent is through Ann (Lilias) Hay the daughter of Dr. James Hay of Dumfries. James was the son of Sir Charles Hay, 2<sup>nd</sup> Baronet of Park (1662-1733). Jean (or Jane) Hay, the sister of Sir Thomas Hay, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of Park (d.c.1666) married Sir Andrew Agnew, 3<sup>rd</sup> Baronet of Lochnaw and was the mother of Grisel Agnew who married Sir Charles Hay, 2<sup>nd</sup> Baronet of Park (her cousin). Ann (Lilias) Hay married Charles Stewart of Shambellie (mentioned below under Stewart of Shambellie).

Forrester (Lords Forrester of Corstorphine from 1633, Lords Dundoyne and Viscounts Grimston from 1719, Lords Verulam and Gorhambury from 1790, Viscounts Grimston and Earls of Verulam from 1815)

The descent is through Elizabeth Forrester (d. 16 March 1578-79) of Corstorphine, Midlothian. She married David MacGill (d. 13 February 1595-96) of Cranstoun Riddel, Cranston, Midlothian and they were the parents of Elizabeth MacGill who married Sir Thomas Kennedy (mentioned above under Kennedy).



#### Hugh of Kevelioc, 5th Earl of Chester

Hugh of Kevelioc (d. 30 June 1181) was the great grandson of King Henry I of England (descended illegitimately). He married Bertrade de Montfort (d.1227). There are at least four different descents from Hugh of Kevelioc.



Lindsay (Earls of Crawford from 1398)

There is more than one descent from Lindsay. One descent is from Elizabeth Lindsay, daughter of Sir David Lindsay, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Crawford (d.c.1407) and Elizabeth Stewart, daughter of Robert II, King of Scotland. Elizabeth married Sir Robert Erskine, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Erskine (and *de jure* 12<sup>th</sup> Earl of Mar).

The 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Crawford was a noted jousting champion who fought the English champion Lord Welles in a remarkable duel on St. George's Day 1390. In the duel, Lindsay unhorsed Welles so easily that the crowd began yelling that he had nailed himself to his saddle. To prove he had not, Lindsay

jumped off his horse and then back on, while still wearing his full suit of armour.



Stewart (Earls of Galloway from 1623)

As given under Gordon (above), Grisel Gordon of Lochinvar, Dalry, Kirkcudbrightshire married Sir Alexander Stewart, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Galloway on 16 October 1600. Our descent is from their daughter, Ann (or Agnes) Stewart who married Sir Andrew Agnew, 2<sup>nd</sup> Baronet of Lochnaw (d.1671). Of interest, Sir Alexander Stewart was

an 8<sup>th</sup> great grandfather of Sír Winston Churchill (1874-1965).



Boyd (Lords Boyd from 1451/54 and Earls of Kilmarnock from 1661)

There are two descents through Margaret Boyd of Kilmarnock, Ayrshire, daughter of Thomas Boyd (d. 9 July 1439). Margaret married Alexander Montgomerie, Lord Montgomerie of Ardrossan, Ayrshire. Their daughter Elizabeth married John Kennedy, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Kennedy and great great grandfather of the Sir Thomas Kennedy

(mentioned above under Kennedy). Their son, Alexander Montgomerie married Elizabeth Hepburn of Hailes, and were the  $3^{rd}$  great grandparents of Christian Douglas (mentioned above under Dunbar).

There is also a descent through Marion (Margaret) Boyd (d.1559), mistress to King James IV. She was the daughter of Archibald Boyd of Bonshaw and Nariston, who was the son of Robert Boyd, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Boyd (he was the son of Thomas Boyd mentioned above).



# Campbell (Earls and later Dukes of Argyll)

There are two descents. Firstly, from Isabel Campbell (1483-1529), she was the daughter of Archibald Campbell, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Argyll. Isabel married Gilbert Kennedy, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Cassillis and they were the grand parents of the Sir Thomas Kennedy mentioned above under Kennedy.

Secondly, from Isabel Campbell's aunt, Helen Campbell, (sister of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Argyll), who married Hugh Montgomerie (d. September 1545), 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Eglinton.



Borthwick (Lords of Borthwick from circa 1450)

The descent is from Agnes Borthwick, daughter of William Borthwick, 3<sup>rd</sup> Lord Borthwick (d. 20 May 1503). Agnes married David Kennedy, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Cassillis (d. 9 September 1513). They were the great grandparents of the Sir Thomas Kennedy mentioned above under Kennedy.



Agnew (Baronets of Lochnaw from 1629)

There are multiple descents from the Agnews of Lochnaw, see above under Dunbar, Gordon, Kennedy and Hay. Also see below under Vaux.



#### Keíth

The descent is from Margaret Keith, daughter of William Keith (d. Bet. 13 May 1407 - 2 June 1413) of Keith, East Lothian. Margaret married James Lindsay (d.1397), Lord of Crawford and Symington who is mentioned above under Lindsay.



Fraser (of Touch Fraser, Oliver Castle and Frednaught)

There are at least four descents. Firstly, from Margaret Fraser of Touch Fraser, Stirlingshire who married the William Keith (mentioned above under Keith) on 3 May 1351. Margaret was the daughter of John Fraser who was the son of Alexander Fraser (d.1332) and Mary Bruce (the sister of King Robert I of Scotland).

The second descent is from Mary (or Margaret) Fraser, daughter of Simon Fraser (d.1306), Knight of Oliver Castle. The Margaret Fraser who married William Keith was

the third cousin, twice removed of Mary Fraser. Mary married Gilbert Hay of Locherworth and they were great great grandparents of William Hay, Knight of Yester who is mentioned below under Hay of Yester.

The third descent is from Matilda Fraser, daughter of James Fraser, Knight of Frednaught (Matilda was a second cousin to the Margaret Fraser named above who married William Keith and a third cousin, twice removed of the Mary Fraser who married Simon Fraser mentioned above). Matilda married Alexander Dunbar, son of John Dunbar, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Moray and Marjorie Stewart (daughter of Robert II). Matilda and Alexander Dunbar were great-great grandparents of the

Margaret Dunbar mentioned above under Dunbar.



Finally there is a descent from Euphemia Fraser, daughter of William Fraser of Dundee and granddaughter of Hugh Fraser (d. Bet. 30 March 1407 - 30 March 1410), Lord of Lovat. This Hugh Fraser was the 2<sup>nd</sup> cousin of the Matilda Fraser mentioned above. The arms used by the Frasers of Lovat are depicted at right.



Sinclair (Earls of Orkney and later Earls of Caithness)

There are multiple descents from Sinclair. One descent is from Catherine Sinclair, daughter of William Sinclair, 3rd Earl of Orkney. Catherine Sinclair married Alexander Stewart, Duke of Albany (d.1485), son of James II, King of Scotland.



Clare (Lords of Clare, Earls of Gloucester, Hertford and Pembroke)

The descent is from four of Gilbert FitzRichard (d. Bet. 1114-1117), Lord of Clare's children. Richard de Clare (d. 1136), Gilbert de Clare (d. 1147/48), 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Pembroke, Rohese FitzGilbert and Adelize de Clare (d. 1163) are all ancestors.



de Vere (Earls of Oxford)

There are at least three descents. Firstly, from Rohese de Vere (d. Aft. 21 October 1166), daughter of Aubrey de Vere (d. 1141) and Adelize de Clare (d. 1163), mentioned above under Clare.

Secondly, there is also descent from Juliana de Vere (the sister of Rohese). Juliana married Hugh Bigod (d. Bef. 9 March 1176/77), 1st Earl of Norfolk.

A more recent descent is from Joan de Vere, daughter of Richard de Vere, 5<sup>th</sup> Earl of Oxford (d.1296). Joan married William de Warenne (1256-86).




de Brus (Earls of Carrick from circa 1312/13)

There are two descents from Robert de Brus (d. 1304), Earl of Carrick. The first descent is through his son King Robert I of Scotland (d. 7 June 1329) and secondly through his daughter, Isobel de Brus (half-sister of Robert I), who married Sir Thomas Randolph of Strathdon.



Papedy (or Papedie)

The descent is from Nichola Papedy who married Sir Thomas Home (of that Ilk) of Dunglass, East Lothian. They were great-great grandparents of Alexander Home,  $2^{nd}$  Lord Home mentioned above under Home.



Marshal (Earl of Pembroke, 2<sup>nd</sup> creation)

The descent is from Maud Marshal, the daughter of William Marshal, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Pembroke (of the second creation), mentioned above under le Bigod. William Marshal is widely regarded as the greatest knight to have ever lived.



Stewart (Lairds of Shambellie)

The descent is from Lilias Stewart (1753 - 21 January 1809), daughter of Charles Stewart of Shambellie (1716- 22 May 1786). Lilias married David Staig (1743- 21 October 1826), for many years the Provost of Dumfries, Scotland.

Hepburn (Lords of Hailes, Earls of Bothwell from 1488 and Duke of Orkney, 1567)

There are at least three descents from Hepburn. Firstly, from Elizabeth Hepburn, daughter of Adam Hepburn, "Master of Hailes" (d.1479). Elizabeth married Alexander Home, "Master of Home", they were the parents of Alexander Home,  $2^{nd}$  Lord Home mentioned above under Home. Secondly, from Margaret Hepburn, the sister of

Adam Hepburn, "Master of Hailes". Margaret married Archibald Forrester (d.1512/13)

of Corstorphine. Thirdly, from another Elizabeth Hepburn, the aunt of Adam Hepburn, "Master of Hailes" (d.1479). Elizabeth was the sister of Patrick Hepburn, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Hailes (d.1483). She married Alexander Montgomerie, "Master of Montgomerie" (d.1452) and they were great-great grandparents of Christian Montgomerie mentioned below under Montgomerie.



Carlyle (of Torthorwald, Lords of Carlyle from 1473/74)


The descent is from Mariot Carlyle (d. after 1 June 1486). She was the daughter of John Carlyle,  $1^{st}$  Lord Carlyle of Torthorwald (d. Bet. 12 January 1500 - 23 July 1501). Mariot married Herbert Herries, 1st Lord Herries of Terregles. They were the parents of Andrew Herries,  $2^{nd}$  Lord Herries mentioned above under Home.



Herries (Lords Herries of Terregles from circa 1489)

There are at least two descents. One descent is from Catherine Herries (d. 8 February 1592/93), daughter of William Herries, 3rd Lord Herries of Terregles (d. 26 September 1543), the son of Andrew Herries, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Herries, mentioned above under Home. There is also descent from William Herries, 3rd Lord Herries of Terregles

other daughter (who inherited the barony of Terregles from her father), Agnes Herries, Baroness Herries of Terregles. Agnes married John Maxwell, who became Lord Herries of Terregles in right of her, he is mentioned below under Maxwell.



#### Comyn (Earls of Buchan)

There are two descents. Firstly, from Elizabeth Comyn (d.1267), daughter of William Comyn, Earl of Buchan (d. 1233). Elizabeth married William, Earl of Mar and their granddaughter Isabel married Robert I of Scotland (1274-1329). The second descent is from Alexander Comyn, Earl of Buchan (Elizabeth's brother) who married Elizabeth de Quincy (d. 12 April 1282), mentioned below under de

Quíncy. Their daughter Emma (her name is not certain, in some sources she is referred to as Agnes), married Malise, 6<sup>th</sup> Earl of Strathearn.




de Montfort (Counts of Évreux)

The descent is from Bertrade de Montfort (d. 1227), daughter of Simon de Montfort, Count of Évreux (d. March 1180-81). Bertrade married Hugh of Kevelioc, 5th Earl of Chester (a great grandson of Henry I, descended illegitimately).



Kirkpatrick (Lords of Closeburn)

The descent is from Elizabeth Kirkpatrick, daughter of Duncan Kirkpatrick (d. Bef. 4 June 1425). Elizabeth Kirkpatrick married William Carlyle of Torthorwald (some sources state she married John Carlyle, 1st Lord Carlyle of Torthorwald, whom I have as her son).




Montgomerie (Lords Montgomerie from 1445 and Earls of Eglinton from 1506/07)

The descent is from Christian Montgomerie (d. 9 August 1575), daughter of John Montgomerie, "Master of Eglinton" (d. 30 April 1520). John Montgomerie was the son of Hugh Mongomerie, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Eglinton. Christian married Sir James Douglas of Drumlanrig (1498-1578), a grandson of the James Douglas mentioned below under Scott.



Murray (of Cockpool, Baronets from 1625 and Earl of Annandale 1636-1658)

The descent is from Agnes Murray (d. Aft. 1560), daughter of John Murray, Knight of Cockpool, Ruthwell. Agnes married James Kennedy of Blairquhan and their daughter Catherine was the wife of William Herries, 3rd Lord Herries of Terregles (d. 26 September 1543), mentioned above under Herries.



de Quíncy (Earls of Winchester)


The descent is from Elizabeth de Quincy (d. 12 April 1282), daughter of Roger De Quincy, 2nd Earl of Winchester (d. 25 April 1265). Elizabeth married Alexander Comyn, Earl of Buchan (d. 1289). The arms depicted at left are those of Saer de Quincy, 1<sup>st</sup>

*Earl of Winchester and father of Roger de Quincy. Saer de Quincy was one of the witnesses to Magna Carta. The arms at right appear to have been used at a later date.* 



Erskine (of Kinnoull, Lords Erskine from 1439 and Earls of Mar from 1565)

The descent is from Elizabeth Erskine, daughter of John (also known as William) Esrkine, Knight of Kinnoull, Perthshire (d. 1445). Elizabeth married Robert Crichton, Knight, who is mentioned above under Crichton. Elizabeth was the 2<sup>nd</sup> cousin (once removed of Christian Erskine (mentioned above).



Gífford

The descent is from Alice Gifford and Joanna Gifford, both daughters of Hugh Gifford of Yester (d. Bef. 11 March 1408/09). Alice married Thomas Boyd, Knight of Kilmarnock (and was a grandfather of the Thomas Boyd mentioned above under Boyd). Joanna married Thomas Hay, Knight of Locherworth (see below

under Hay of Yester).



Hay (of Yester, later Lords of Yester and Earls and Marqesses of Tweeddale, Earls of Gifford and Viscounts Walden)

The descent is from William Hay (d. 1421), Knight of Yester who married Alicia Hay (daughter of Thomas Hay, Knight of Erroll). William Hay was the son of Thomas Hay, Knight of Locherworth and Joanna Gifford of Yester (mentioned above under Gifford). As

can be seen, the arms of Hay were quartered with those of Gifford.



Scott (of Rankilburn and Buccleuch, Lords Scott of Buccleuch from 1606, Earls of Buccleuch from 1619 and Dukes of Buccleuch from 1663)

The descent is from Janet Scott daughter of David Scott (d. March 1491/92) of Buccleuch. Janet married James Douglas, Knight of Drumlanrig (a great great grandson of James Douglas, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of

Douglas). Janet and James were great grandparents of the Christian Douglas mentioned above under Douglas.



Lamont (of Kílfínan)

The descent is from Mary Lamont daughter of John Lamont, Knight of Kilfinan. Mary married Gillespick Campbell, Lord of Lochow on 2 May 1343. They were 3 greats grandparents of Helen Campbell and 4 greats grandparents of Isabel Campbell, (mentioned above under Campbell).



Maxwell (Lords Maxwell of Claerlaverlock)

There are at least four descents. Firstly, from Katherine Maxwell, daughter of Herbert Maxwell, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Maxwell. Katherine married Gilbert Kennedy, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Kennedy circa 1440 and they were 4 greats grandparents of the Margaret Kennedy mentioned above under Kennedy.

Secondly, there is a descent from Janet Maxwell, the sister of Herbert Maxwell, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Maxwell. Janet married William Douglas (d. 1444), Knight of Drumlanrig (and a grandson of James Douglas, 2<sup>nd</sup>

*Earl of Douglas) and they were 3 greats grandparents of the Christian Douglas mentioned above under Douglas.* 

Thirdly, there is a descent from Margaret Maxwell (another sister of Herbert Maxwell, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Maxwell). Margaret married John Montgomerie (d. Bef. 22 November 1429). This John Montgomerie was a 4 greats grandfather of the Christian Montgomerie mentioned above under Montgomerie.

Finally, there is descent from Elizabeth Maxwell (d. Abt. 1620), she was the daughter of John Maxwell, Lord Herries of Terregles, who was Lord Herries of Terregles in right of his wife, Agnes Herries, Baroness Herries of Terregles. Agnes Herries was the daughter and heir of William Herries, 3rd Lord Herries of Terregles (mentioned above under Herries).



# Hoppringle (of that Ilk)

The descent is from Mariota Hoppringle who married William Borthwick (d. Bet. 6 October 1483 - 7 February 1483/84), 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Borthwick. Mariota was the daughter of Thomas Hoppringle (d.1462). Mariota and William Borthwick were grandparents of the Agnes Borthwick mentioned above under Borthwick.



### Edmonstone (of Duntreath, Baronets from 1774)


The descent is from Elizabeth Edmonstone, daughter of Archibald Edmonstone, Knight of Duntreath and his wife Janet Shaw of Sauchie. Murdoch Stewart, 2<sup>nd</sup> Duke of Albany and grandson of Robert II was one of Elizabeth's great-great grandfathers. One of her great grandmothers was Mary Stewart, Princess of Scotland

and daughter of Robert III. Mary Stewart married several times (including to James Kennedy of Dunure, through this marriage, Mary Stewart was a 5 greats grandmother of Margaret Kennedy mentioned above under Kennedy). Another marriage was to Archibald Edmonstone's paternal grandfather, William Edmonstone (d. 1460). Elizabeth married John Montgomerie (d. 30 April 1520), mentioned above under Montgomerie. They were the parents of Christian Montgomerie also mentioned above under Montgomerie.



Shaw (of Sauchie and Greenock)

The descent is from Janet Shaw, mentioned above under Edmonstone. Janet was the daughter of Sir James Shaw of Sauchie, St. Ninians, Stirlingshire. Janet married Sir Archibald Edmonstone of Duntreath.



Stewart (Dukes of Albany, 1<sup>st</sup> Creation)

The descent is from Matilda Stewart, granddaughter of Murdoch Stewart (d. 24 May 1425), 2<sup>nd</sup> Duke of Albany. Matilda married Sir William Edmonstone (d. 1486). Matilda and William were grandparents of Elizabeth Edmonstone mentioned above under Edmonstone.

### Sutherland (Lords of Duffus from 1651)



The descent is from Isobel Sutherland, daughter of Alexander Sutherland (d. Abt. 1484), 3rd of Duffus & Torboll.

Isobel married Alexander Dunbar (d. 10 March 1497/98), knight of Westfield who was an illegitimate son of James Dunbar, 4th Earl of Moray (of the second creation) and Isobel Innes (as mentioned above under Dunbar).

These arms combine the three mullets of the Sutherland arms with a boar's head from the Chisholm arms and the cross-crosslets fitchee of the Cheyne arms. The relationships between these families being that Isobel's mother was Morella (or Muriel) Chisholm of Quarrelwood and Isobel's father's paternal grandmother was Mary le Cheyne.



# Chisholm (of Quarrelwood)

The descent is from Morella (or Muriel) Chisholm, daughter of Robert Chisholm, Knight of Quarrelwood. Morella married Alexander Sutherland (d. Abt. 1484), 3rd of Duffus & Torboll. They were the parents of Isobel Sutherland mentioned above under Sutherland.

In A Genealogical and Heraldic History of the Commoners of Great Britain and Ireland (enjoying territorial possessions or high official rank; but uninvested with heritable honours), Volume IV, by John Burke Esq., London, 1838, it is stated on page 261 that the arms of Chisholm of Quarrelwood are: Azure, three boars heads erased Or. These arms are of course very similar to that of Gordon, however, the boars' heads in the Gordon arms are couped, whereas in the Chisholm arms they are erased.



# Cheyne (of Inverugie, Duffus & Straloch)

The descent is from Mary (le) Cheyne, daughter of Reginald (le) Cheyne (d. Aft. 1320), Knight of Inverugie, Duffus and Straloch. Mary married Nicholas Sutherland, 1<sup>st</sup> of Duffus. They were the paternal grandparents of Alexander Sutherland (d. Abt. 1484), 3rd of Duffus and Torboll, mentioned above under Sutherland and Chisholm.




### Halyburton (of Dirleton)

The descent is from Jean Halyburton, daughter of Walter Halyburton (d. 24 July 1388), Knight of Dirleton. Jean Halyburton married Henry Sinclair, Earl of Orkney.



### Stewart (Lords of Lorn)

The descent is from Elizabeth Stewart (d. 26 October 1510), daughter of John Stewart (d. 20 December 1463), 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord of Lorn. Elizabeth married Colin Campbell (d. 10 May 1493), 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Argyll. They were the parents of Helen Campbell and paternal grandparents of Isabel Campbell (mentioned above under Campbell).



# Innes (of that Ilk)

The descent is from Isobel Innes (mentioned above under Dunbar), she was the daughter of Walter Innes (d. bef. 1456), 10<sup>th</sup> of that Ilk and Euphemia Fraser (mentioned above under Fraser). Isobel had an

illegitimate son, Alexander Dunbar, Knight of Westfield, mentioned above under Dunbar.




Vaux or Vans (of Barnbarroch)

There are at least two descents. Firstly, there is a descent from Mariotta Vaux. Mariotta was the daughter of Robert Vaux of Barnbarroch and Euphemia Graham (daughter of Malise Graham [1406-1490], 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Menteith). Mariotta married Quentin Agnew in 1469. Their 3 greats grandson was Patrick Agnew, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of

Lochnaw who married Margaret Kennedy (mentioned above under Kennedy).

Secondly, there is a descent from Margaret Vans (Vaux), daughter of Patrick Vans (d.1528). Patrick Vans was a grandson of Robert Vaux mentioned above. Margaret married Patrick Dunbar, Knight of Clugston and they were the parents of Margaret Dunbar mentioned above under Dunbar.



Stewart (Earls of Lennox)

The descent is from Elizabeth Stewart, daughter of John Stewart,  $1^{st}$ Earl of Lennox (d.1495). Elizabeth married Archibald Campbell,  $2^{nd}$ Earl of Argyll who is mentioned above under Campbell. King James I (of England), VI (of Scotland) was a great-great-great grandson of John Stewart,  $1^{st}$  Earl of Lennox.



Graham (Earls of Menteith from 1427)

The descent is from Euphemia Graham, daughter of Malise Graham, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Menteith (d.1490). Malise Graham was a great grandson of Robert II. Euphemia married Robert Vaux of Barnbarroch, as mentioned above under Vaux.



Stewart (Earls of Strathearn from 1357)

The descent is from Euphemia Stewart, Countess of Caithness, daughter of David Stewart, Earl of Caithness and Strathearn. David Stewart was the son of Robert II. Euphemia married Patrick Graham (d.1413) who took the title of Earl of Strathearn.



# Graham (of Kincardine)

The descent is as given above under Graham, Earls of Menteith. The arms depicted here are those of Sir David Graham (d.1329) of Kincardine and a great-great grandfather of Malise Graham, 1<sup>st</sup> earl of Menteith (d.1490), mentioned above under Graham.



Makgill or MacGill (Viscounts of Oxfuird from 1651)

The descent is from Elizabeth Makgill (d. January 1621/22), daughter of David Makgill (d. 13 February 1595/96), of Cranstoun Riddel who is mentioned above under Forrester. Elizabeth Makgill married Sir Thomas Kennedy of Culzean who is mentioned above under Kennedy.



Kennedy (of Bargany)

The descent is from Margaret Kennedy (d. Bef. 12 January 1596/97), daughter of Alexander Kennedy. Margaret married Gilbert Kennedy, 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Cassillis (1515-1558).

These arms are the same of those as Kennedy, Earls of Cassillis, the only difference being that the double tressure flory counter

flory in the latter arms were added to the original arms to commemorate the royal descent of that branch of the family from Robert III's daughter Mary.



Wake (Lords Wake of Liddell)

The descent is from Margaret Wake, Baroness Wake of Liddell (d.1349), she married Edmund of Woodstock, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Kent (1301-30), son of Edward I, King of England.




Brabant (Dukes of)

The descent is from Margaret of Brabant (d.1368), daughter of John III, Duke of Brabant (1300-55) and Marie d'Évreux (1303-35). Margaret married Louis II, Count of Flanders (1330-1383/84).



# Burgundy (Dukes of)

The descent is from Marie of Burgundy (1400-66), daughter of John "the fearless", Duke of Burgundy (1371-1419). Marie married Adolf I, Duke of Cleves (1373-1448), referred to below under the Dukes of Cleves.



Llywelyn the Great, Prince of Wales

LLywelyn's wife, Joan, was an illegitimate daughter of King John of England.


There are at least two descents from Llywelyn's daughters, Firstly, from Gwladus ferch Llywelyn (d.1251) who married Ralph de Mortimer (d.1246) and secondly from Elen (Helen) ferch Llywelyn (d.1253) who married Robert de Quincy (d.1257).

Robert de Quincy was the brother of Roger de Quincy, 2nd Earl of Winchester, mentioned above under de Quincy.



#### Mortimer (Lords Mortimer)

The descent is from Isabella Mortimer (d.1292), daughter of Roger Mortimer, 1<sup>st</sup> Baron Mortimer (1231-82). Isabella married John Fitzalan, 7<sup>th</sup> Earl of Arundel (1246-1271/72), a great grandfather of Richard Fitzalan, 10<sup>th</sup> Earl of Arundel (mentioned above under the Earls of Arundel).



Counts of Hainaut (left) and Holland (right)

One descent is from Philippa of Hainaut (1314-69), granddaughter of John II, Count of Hainaut and Holland. Philippa was the wife of King Edward III of England.



#### Beaufort (Earls of Somerset)

The descent is from Queen Joan Beaufort (1404-45), daughter of John Beaufort, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Somerset (1373-1410) {a legitimised son of John of Gaunt, 1st Duke of Lancaster and Katherine Swynford}. Joan married King James I of Scotland (1394-1436/37). Our descent is through both her marriage to James I and also her marriage to James Stewart, the Black Knight of Lorn and their son, John Stewart, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Atholl (d.1512).




#### Stewart (Earls of Atholl)

The descent is from Janet Stewart, daughter of John Stewart, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Atholl (d.1520/22). Janet married (inter alia) Sir Hugh Kennedy of Girvanmains, grandson of John Kennedy, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Kennedy and half 1<sup>st</sup> cousin (3 times removed) of the Margaret Kennedy of Culzean mentioned above under Kennedy, Earls of Cassillis.



#### Le Botiller (Baron Butler)

The descent is through Thomas le Botiller (d.1230), son of Thomas Walter (le Botiller), 1<sup>st</sup> Baron Butler (d.1205/06) and his wife Maud le Vavasour. Margaret Butler, the paternal grandmother of Anne Boleyn (1501-36, 2<sup>nd</sup> wife of Henry VIII), was a direct descendant of the 1<sup>st</sup> Baron Butler.



#### de Braose (Lords of Bramber)


The descent is from Maude de Braose (1224 – Bef. 1300/01), daughter of William de Braose (d.1230), a grandson of William de Braose, 4<sup>th</sup> Lord of Bramber. Maude de Braose married Roger Mortimer, 1<sup>st</sup> Baron Mortimer (1231-82), mentioned above under Mortimer.



Peard (of Coole, Ireland)


These arms are only relevant to those descended from Catherine Peard (d.1843), daughter of Henry Peard (1740-1787) of Coole Abbey. Catherine married David Staig (1775-1860) on 24 May 1806 in Dungourney, Ireland. David Staig was the son of Lilias Stewart of Shambellie (mentioned above under Stewart of Shambellie).

Gunning (Baronets of Eltham from 23 November 1778)

These arms are only relevant to those descended from Jessie Miller Babington (1803-81), a granddaughter of Lilias Stewart of Shambellie (mentioned above under Stewart of Shambellie) and niece to David Staig (mentioned above under Peard). Jessie married John Gunning (1801-45) and their great grandson, Sir Robert Charles Gunning (1901-1989) became the 8<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Eltham in 1950.



Beaumont (Earls of Warwick)

The descent is from Alice de Beaumont, daughter of Waleran de Beaumont, 4th Earl of Warwick (1153-1204) and Alice de Harcourt. Alice married William de Maudit, Lord Hanslape.



# Drummond (of Stoball)

The descent is from Annabella Drummond (d.1401), wife of King Robert III of Scotland. Annabella was the daughter of Sir John Drummond of Stoball and Mary Montefichet (Montifex).




### Montpellier

The descent is from Marie (or Mary) of Montpellier (d.1219), daughter of William of Montpellier. Marie married Peter II, King of Aragon (1178-1213).



Counts of Geneva

The descent is from Margaret (Marguerite) of Geneva, daughter of William I, Count of Geneva (d. 25 July 1195). Margaret married Thomas I, Count of Savoy (d.1233).



# de Sabran (Lord of Caylar and Ansouis)

The descent is from Garsenda de Sabran, Countess of Forcalquier, daughter of Rénier de Sabran, Lord of Caylar and Ansouis and Garsenda of Forcalquier (daughter of William IV, Count of Forcalquier d. 1208). Garsenda de Sabran married Alfonso II, Count of Provence (1174-1209).



#### House of Este

The descent is from Guelph (Welf) IV (or I), Duke of Bavaria (d. 1101), son of Albert Azzo II, Margrave of Este (d. 1097). Welf IV married Judith of Flanders (1033-1093/94), daughter of Baldwin IV, Count of Flanders (d.1035) and Eleanor of Normandy, daughter of Richard II, Duke of Normandy (963-1026).



### de Mandeville (Earl of Essex)

The descent is from Maud de Mandeville, daughter of Geoffrey de Mandeville, 1st Earl of Essex (d. 1144) and his wife Rohese de Vere (mentioned above under de Vere). Maud married Piers de Lutegareshale of Ludgershall, Salisbury, Wiltshire (d. 1198).




### Counts of Champagne

The descent is from Theobald III, Count of Champagne (1179-1201), son of Henry I, Count of Champagne (1127-80/81) and his wife Marie of France (1145-97/98), daughter of King Louis VII of France (1120-80). Theobald III married Blanche of Navarre (d.1229), the daughter of Sancho VI, King of Navarre (1132-94).



### Counts of Burgundy

The descent is from Margaret I, Countess of Burgundy (1310-82), daughter of Joan II, Countess of Burgundy (d.1329/30) and King Philip V of France and Navarre (d.1321/22). Margaret I married Louis I, Count of Flanders who died in the Battle of Crécy in 1346.



# Counts of Forcalquíer

The descent is from Garsenda of Forcalquier, daughter of William IV, Count of Forcalquier (d. 1208) and his wife Adelaide de Beziers. Garsenda married Rénier de Sabran, Lord of Caylar and Ansouis, who is mentioned above under de Sabran.



#### Counts of Namur

The descent is from Alice of Namur, daughter of Godfrey I, Count of Namur (d.1139) and Ermesinde of Luxembourg (d.1143), daughter of Conrad I, Count of Luxembourg (d.1086). Alice married Baldwin IV, Count of Hainaut. Philippa of Hainaut (mentioned above under the Counts of Hainaut), was a five greats granddaughter of Baldwin IV.



### Beauchamp (Earls of Warwick)

The descent is from Isabella de Beauchamp (d. Bef. 30 May 1306), daughter of William de Beauchamp, 9th Earl of Warwick (1237-98), a great grandson of Waleran de Beaumont, 4th Earl of Warwick (who is mentioned above under the Beaumont Earls of Warwick). Isabella married Patrick de Chaworth, Lord of Kidwelly.



### MacDowall (Lairds of Garthland)

The descent is from Janet MacDowall, daughter of Uchtred Macdowall of Garthland, Renfrewshire, Scotland (d.c.1600). Janet married Thomas Hay of Park (d. Bef. 12 September 1628). Ann (Lilias) Hay (mentioned above under Hay) was a four greats granddaughter of Janet MacDowall and Thomas Hay of Park.

Uchtred Macdowall was married twice, firstly to Margaret Kennedy daughter of Sir Hugh Kennedy of Girvanmains (and Janet Stewart daughter of John Stewart, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Atholl) and secondly to Margaret Stewart, also a daughter of the same

#### Janet Stewart by a different father - Henry Stewart, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Methven.



#### de Stutevílle

The descent is from Joan de Stuteville (d. Bef. 6 April 1276), daughter of Nicholas de Stuteville (d. 8 September 1233) and Devorguilla of Galloway. Joan married Hugh Wake (d. Bef. 18 December 1241). Their great granddaughter, Margaret Wake, Baroness Wake of Liddell, married Edmund of Woodstock, 1st Earl of Kent (1301-30), son of Edward I (1239-1307).



#### Grandmesníl

The descent is from Petronilla de Grandmesnil (d.1212), daughter of William de Grandmesnil. Petronilla married Robert de Beaumont, 3rd Earl of Leicester (d.1190).

Robert de Beaumont was the half 1<sup>st</sup> cousin (3 times removed) of William de Beauchamp, 9th Earl of Warwick (mentioned above

under the Beauchamp Earls of Warwick) and the half 1<sup>st</sup> cousin of Waleran de Beaumont, 4th Earl of Warwick (mentioned above under the Beaumont Earls of Warwick).



#### de Remilly

The descent is from Lucy de Remilly, daughter of Robert de Remilly Lord of Harewood. Lucy married Jordan de Say (fl.1127). Lucy de Remilly and Jordan de Say were great grandparents of Agnès du Hommet (mentioned below under du Hommet).



#### du Hommet

The descent is from Agnès du Hommet (d. Aft. 1224), daughter of William du Hommet, Seigneur du Hommet (d.c.1204). Agnès married Baldwin Wake of Bourne, Lincolnshire and they were 3 greats grandparents of Margaret Wake (mentioned above under Wake - Lords Wake of Liddell).



Gumbleton (of Castle Richard, County Waterford, Ireland)

The descent is from Mary Gumbleton, daughter of Richard Gumbleton (1721-76) of Castle Richard. Mary married Henry Peard (1740-87) of Coole Abbey on 5 September 1764 and they were the parents of Catherine Peard (who is mentioned

de Límesí

The descent is from Alienora de Limesi, daughter of Gerard de Limesi and Amicia de Bidun. Alienora married William de Lindsay, Baron of Luffness (d.c.1200). Alienora and William de Lindsay were ancestors of Sir David Lindsay, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Crawford mentioned above under Lindsay.



de Warenne (Earls of Surrey)

The descent is from Ada de Warenne, Countess of Huntingdon (d.1178), daughter of William de Warenne,  $2^{nd}$  Earl of Surrey (d. 11 May 1138) and Elisabeth (Isabelle) de Vermandois. Ada married Henry, Earl of Huntingdon and Northumbria (1114-52), son of King David I of Scotland (1084-1153). She was mother of King Malcolm IV of Scotland (d.1165) and King William "The Lion" of

Scotland (d.1214).

A later descent is from William de Warenne (1256-86), son of John de Warenne, 6th Earl of Surrey (1231-1304). William married Joan de Vere, daughter of Richard de Vere, 5<sup>th</sup> Earl of Oxford (d.1296).



Lauder (of the Bass, Whitslaid and Haltoun)

The descent is from Marion (or Mariota) Lauder, daughter of John Lauder (d.1421) and Katherine de Landells of Berwickshire, daughter of William de landells, Lord Swynset. Marion married Alexander Home, 1st Lord Home (d. Bet. 3 February 1459/60 - April 1461). They were 15 greats grandparents of Sir Winston Churchill (1874-1965).

John Lauder (d.1421) was the son of Sir Robert Lauder of Edrington and Bass (d.1425) who was in turn the son of Alan de Lawedre of the Bass, Whitslaid and Haltoun (d. Bef. 21 March 1406/07). Alan de Lawedre's wife was Alicia Campbell, daughter of Colin Campbell, Lord of Lochow.



Balfour of that Ilk


The descent is from Janet Balfour, daughter of John Balfour, knight of Balfour. Janet married Robert de Bethune about 1360.

The animal depicted on the chevron is an Otter's head (erased).




Stírlíng of Keír

The descent is from Catherine Stirling, daughter of William Stirling, knight of Keir (d. Bet. 1468-71) and Margaret Cunninghame. Catherine married John Bethune of Balfour (a great-great grandson of the Robert de Bethune mentioned above under Balfour).

The descent is from Elizabeth Melville, daughter of Sir John Melville of Raith and Margaret Scott. Elizabeth married David Boswell (d. 17 June 1490) of Balgregie and Boswell.




# Bethune (of Balfour)

The descent is from Elizabeth Bethune, daughter of John Bethune (b.1465) and Elizabeth (Isabel) Moneypenny of Pitmilly, Fife. Elizabeth married John Wardlaw of Torrie. Elizabeth Bethune was a five greats granddaughter of the Robert de Bethune mentioned above under Balfour.



### Wardlaw (of Torrie)

The descent is from Helen Wardlaw, daughter of Henry Wardlaw and Alison Home. Helen married Sir James Makgill and they were grandparents of the Elizabeth Makgill mentioned above under Makgill. Helen Wardlaw was a granddaughter of the John Wardlaw of Torrie mentioned above under Bethune.



### Moneypenny (of Pítmílly)

The descent is from Elizabeth (or Isabel) Moneypenny (mentioned above under Bethune). Elizabeth was the daughter of David Moneypenny. The arms of this family are blazoned in both ways depicted at right, depending on what source one consults.



# de Say (of Kirtlington, Oxfordshire)

The descent is from Agnes de Say, daughter of Jordan de Say and Lucy de Remilly (mentioned above under de Remilly). Agnes married Richard du Hommet (d.1181) and they were the paternal grandparents of the Agnès du Hommet mentioned above under du Hommet.



### Boswell (of Balmuto and Balgregie)

The descent is from Marjorie Boswell, daughter of David Boswell (d.1490) and Elizabeth Melville (mentioned above under Melville). Marjorie married John Bethune and they were the grandparents of the Elizabeth Bethune mentioned above under Bethune. There is also a descent from Euphame Boswell whose father David Boswell was the brother of Marjorie Boswell (see below under Meldrum).




#### Menzies (of that Ilk and also Weem)

The descent is from Marjorie Menzies, daughter of John Menzies and Janet Carruthers (mentioned below under Carruthers). Marjorie married Cuthbert Murray (d.1493) of Cockpool and they were the paternal grandparents of Agnes Murray mentioned above under Murray.



### Carruthers (of Holmains, sometimes written 'Howmains')

The descent is from Janet Carruthers mentioned above under Menzies. Janet was the daughter of Roger Carruthers. As with many of the individuals detailed here, Janet Carruthers and her husband were ancestors of Sir Winston Churchill (1874-1965), in this case, 15 greats grandparents.



Warren (of Kilbarry, [Warren's Court], Cork)

The descent is from Anne Crooke Warren, daughter of Wallis Warren and Elizabeth Knowles. Anne married Richard Gumbleton (d.1757) and they were the paternal grandparents of the Mary Gumbleton mentioned above under Gumbleton.


Anne Crooke Warren's nephew, Robert Warren became the 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of Kílbarry ín 1784.

#### Chaworth (Lords of Kidwelly)

The descent is from Maud Chaworth (1288-1322), daughter of Patrick de Chaworth, Lord of Kidwelly and Isabella de Beauchamp (daughter of the 9<sup>th</sup> Earl of Warwick). Maud married Henry, 3rd Earl of Lancaster (1281-1345), grandson of Henry III, King of England.



#### Cockburn of that Ilk, Langton & Henderland

The descent is from Margaret Cockburn of Henderland (d. Aft. 1463), daughter of Piers de Cockburn of Henderland. Margaret married Sir Walter Scott of Buccleuch & Branxholme and they were grandparents of the Janet Scott mentioned above under Scott.



#### de Veterí-Ponte

The descent is from Mariota de Veteri-Ponte, daughter of Sir William de Veteri-Ponte of Langton, Carriden and Bolton (killed in the Battle of Bannockburn). Mariota married Alexander de Cokburn of that Ilk and Langton and they were the parents of Piers deCockburn mentioned above under Cockburn.




#### de Morville

The descent is from Elena de Morville (d.1217), daughter of Richard de Morville (d.1189) of Lauder and Avice de Lancaster. Elena married Roland of Galloway (d.1200), "Lord of Galloway". Interestingly, these arms are practically identical to those of MacDowall of Garthland (see above).



#### Víscounts of Thouars

The descent is from Alix of Thouars (d.1221), daughter of Guy of Thouars (d.1213) and Constance, Duchess of Brittany (1161-1201). Alix married Peter I, Duke of Brittany (in right of his wife), he died in 1250.



#### de Rouchefoucould (Viscounts of Châtellerault)

*The descent is from Eleanor of Châtellerault, daughter of Aimery I de Rouchefoucould (d.*1151), *Viscount of Châtellerault and* 

Amauberge de l'Isle Bouchard. Eleanor married William X (1099-1137), Duke of Aquitaine and they were grandparents of Richard I and John, Kings of England.



#### Dukes of Aquitaine

The descent is from Eleanor of Aquitaine (1122-1204), daughter of William X (1099-1137), Duke of Aquitaine and Eleanor of Châtellerault (mentioned above under de Rouchefoucould). Eleanor married Henry II, King of England and was the mother of Richard I and John, Kings of England.




#### Brechin (Lords of Brechin)

The descent is from Margaret de Brechin, daughter of Sir David de Brechin, Lord of Brechin (d.c.1320). Margaret married Sir David Barclay (d.1350/51) who became Lord of Brechin in right of her.




#### Seton

The descent is from Sir Alexander Seton, Lord Gordon (c.1388-1440/41), son of Sir William Seton and Janet Fleming. Sir Alexander Seton married Elizabeth Gordon (d.1438/39) and their son (adopting his mother's maiden name) was Sir Alexander Gordon, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Huntley. The arms are identical to those of Edmonstone.




#### Fleming (Lords and Earls of Wigtown)

The descent is from Janet Fleming (mentioned above under Seton), daughter of Sir David Fleming of Biggar and Cumbernauld (d.1405/06).




Ross (Earls of Ross)

The descent is from Euphemia de Ross, Countess of Ross (d. aft. 5 September 1394), daughter of William de Ross, 5<sup>th</sup> Earl of Ross (d.1371/72). Euphemia married Walter Leslie (d.1381/82) who became Earl of Ross in right of her.



# Gordon (Earls of Huntley)

The descent is from Elizabeth Gordon (d.1500), daughter of Sir Alexander Gordon, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Huntley (d.1470), mentioned above under Seton. Elizabeth married John Kennedy, 2<sup>nd</sup> Lord Kennedy (d.1508). John Kennedy was a three greats grandfather of the Margaret Kennedy mentioned above under Kennedy.



# Lusígnan (Counts of La Marche)

The descent is from Alice de Lusignan (1224-1255/56), daughter of Hugh X de Lusignan, Count of La Marche (d.1249). Alice married John de Warenne, 6th Earl of Surrey (1231-1304).




#### d'Albon

The descent is from Béatrice of Albon (1161-1228), daughter of Guigues V, Count of Albon & Dauphin of Viennois (d.1162). Béatrice married Hugh III, Duke of Burgundy (1142-92).



# Counts of Luxembourg

The descent is from Philippa of Luxembourg (1252-1311), daughter of Henry V, Count of Luxembourg (1216-81) and Margaret of Bar. Philippa married John II, Count of Hainaut and Holland (1247-1304).




### Counts of Dreux

The descent is from Yolande de Dreux (1212-48), daughter of Robert III Count of Dreux & Braine (1185-1234). Yolande married Hugh IV, Duke of Burgundy (d.1272).



de St. Valéry

The descent is from Alianor de St. Valéry (1192-1250), wife of Robert III Count of Dreux & Braine (1185-1234), mentioned above under the Counts of Dreux.



#### Де Соису

The descent is from Yolande de Coucy (1164-1222), wife of Robert II, Count of Dreux (1154-1218). They were the parents of Robert III Count of Dreux & Braine (1185-1234), mentioned above under the Counts of Dreux and under de St. Valéry.



#### *Counts of Bar*

The descent is from Margaret of Bar (1220-75), daughter of Henry II, Count of Bar (1190-1239) and Philippa de Dreux (1192-1242) [the Aunt of Yolande de Dreux mentioned above under the Counts of Dreux]. Margaret married Henry V, Count of Luxembourg (1216-81).



### le Vavasour

The descent is from Maud le Vavasour (d. Bef. 1226), wife of the Thomas Walter (le Botiller) mentioned above under le Botiller (Baron Butler). Maud was the daughter of Robert le Vavasour, the son of Sir William le Vavasour, Lord of Hazelwood (d.1191).



### de Camville

The descent is from Isabelle de Camville, daughter of Sir Richard de Camville (d.1191), an English crusader knight, and one of Richard I "the Lionheart's" senior commanders during the Third Crusade. Isabelle married Robert de Harcourt (d.1202).



de Ferrers (Earls of Derby of the first creation)

The descent is from Isabel de Ferrers of Oakham Castle (d. Bef. 29 April 1252), daughter of William de Ferrers, 3rd Earl of Derby (d.1190) and Sybil de Braose, sister of William de Braose, 4th Lord of Bramber who is mentioned above under de Braose. Isabel married Roger de Mortimer of Wigmore Castle.



# Margraves of Saluzzo

The descent is from Alice of Saluzzo (d.1292), daughter of Thomas I, 4th Margrave of Saluzzo (1239-96) and Luisa of Ceva. Alice married Richard Fitzalan, 8th Earl of Arundel (1266/67-1301/02). They were the grandparents of Richard Fitzalan, 10th Earl of Arundel (mentioned above under Fitzalan, Earls of Arundel).



### Glen of Balmuto

The descent is from Christian Glen, daughter of Sir John Glen of Balmuto (d.1419) and Margaret Erskine of Inchmartin. Christian married Sir John Boswell of Balgregie.



# Inchmartín of that Ilk

The descent is from Isabel Inchmartin (d.c.1399), daughter of John Inchmartin of that Ilk and Margaret Wemyss. Isabel married Alan Erskine (d.1400) who was the great great grand uncle of the Elizabeth Erskine mentioned above under Erskine.



Wemyss (Earls of Wemyss from 1633 and Earls of March from 1697)

The descent is from Margaret Wemyss, mentioned above under Inchmartin. Margaret was the daughter of Sir Michael Wemyss (d.c.1342) who was at the siege of Lochleven in 1335, his father, Sir David Wemyss was one of the signatories of the letter to the Pope

asserting the independence of Scotland.



# Cameron of Balegarno

The descent is from Jean Cameron, daughter of Sir John Cameron of Balegarno (d. bef. 1384). Jean married Sir Nicholas Erskine of Kinnoul (d. bef. Dec. 1406), they were great grandparents of the Elizabeth Erskine mentioned above under Erskine.



Crichton (Earl of Caithness 1452-54)

The descent is from Janet Crichton, daughter of Sir George Crichton, Earl of Caithness (d.1454). Janet married John Maxwell, "Master of Maxwell" (in some sources he is referred to as 3<sup>rd</sup> Lord Maxwell). The arms at right are from a seal of Sir George Crichton dating from circa 1450 (obviously not blazoned).



# de Faucigny (Counts of Faucigny)

The descent is from (Marguerite) Beatrice de Faucigny, daughter of Aimon I, Count of Faucigny (d.1178). Beatrice married William I, Count of Geneva (d.1195). They were ancestors of many Kings of England and France.



# Béthune (Lords of Béthune)

The descent is from Matilda Béthune (d.1264) daughter of Robert VII, Lord of Béthune (d.1248). Matilda married Guy of Dampierre, Count of Flanders (d.1304/05).



### Dampierre (Lords of Dampierre)

The descent is from Margaret of Flanders (d.1285) daughter of Matilda Béthune and Guy of Dampierre, Count of Flanders (mentioned above under Béthune). Guy of Dampierre was the son of William II, Lord of Dampierre (d.1231). Margaret married John I, Duke of Brabant (d.1294).




Bargany. Sír John Hamilton of Lettrick's son, Sír John Hamilton (d.1658) was raised to the peerage in 1641 as Lord Bargany. This title is said to have become extinct in 1736 on the death of James Hamilton, 4<sup>th</sup> Lord Bargany.

Hamilton (inter alia Lords of Hamilton, Earls of Arran, Marquesses of Hamilton, Dukes of Hamilton and Chatelherault)

The descent is from Jean Hamilton daughter of Sir John Hamilton of Lettrick (an illegitimate son of John Hamilton, 1<sup>st</sup> Marquess of Hamilton d.1604). Jean Hamilton married Sir Thomas Hay of Park (d.c.1683) in 1632 and they were the parents of Sir Thomas Hay, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of Park (mentioned above under Hay).

Shown below are the arms of Hamilton of





d'Avesnes (Seígneur d'Avesnes)

The descent is from Beatrice d'Avesnes (d.1321) daughter of Baldwin of Avesnes (1219-95) and Felicitas of Coucy. Beatrice married Henry VI, Count of Luxembourg (d.1288) and they were the parents of Henry VII, Holy Roman Emperor (d.1313) who in turn was the father

of John the Blind, King of Bohemia (1296-1346) who famously died in the Battle of Crécy.



Coucy (Lords of Coucy and Vervins)

The descent is from Felicitas of Coucy (mentioned above under d'Avesnes). She was the daughter of Thomas II of Coucy, Lord of Vervins.

#### Counts of Rieneck

The descent is from Agnes von Mainz daughter of Gerhard I, Count of Rieneck and Helwig von Bliescastel. Agnes married Arnold I, Count of Looz (1060-1135).

A five greats grandson of this couple was the Holy Roman Emperor Louis IV (1282-1347).

It should be noted that the arms depicted at left would never have been used by Gerhard I, as his life pre-dates the use of heritable arms.






Habsburg (inter alia Counts of Habsburg, Kings of Germany, Hungary, Bohemia, Spain and Holy Roman Emperors)

There are multiple descents from Habsburg. One descent is from Anna (or Anne) of Austria (d.1326/27), daughter of Albert I, King of Germany (1255-1308). Anna married Herman, Margrave of Brandenburg-Salzwedel (d.1307/08).



#### Counts of Oldenburg

The descent is from Dietrich (Theodoric), Count of Oldenburg (d.1439/40). He married Helvig of Schauenburg (d.1436) and they were the parents of Christian I, King of Denmark (1426-81).



#### Counts of Berg

The descent is from Oda of Berg-Altena (d.1224) daughter of Eberhard I, Count of Berg-Altena (d.1179/80) and Adelheid von Arnsberg (d.1200). Oda married Simon I, Count of Tecklenburg (d.1202).

A great-granddaughter of Oda and Simon I was Matilda (Mechthild ) of Holstein (d.1288), the wife of Abel, King of Denmark (1218-52).



#### Counts of Ballenstedt

The descent is from Otto, Count of Ballenstedt (d.1122/23), son of Adalbert II, Count of Ballenstedt and Adelaide of Weimar-Orlamünde. Otto married Eilika of Saxony (d.1141/42), daughter of Magnus, Duke of Saxony and granddaughter of Béla I, King of Hungary. Otto was the father of Albert the Bear, Margrave of Brandenburg (d.1170).



#### Víscontí (Lords of Mílan)

The descent is from Maddalena Visconti (1366-1404) daughter of Bernabò Visconti, Lord of Milan (1323-85) and Beatrice Regina della Scala (1331-84). Maddalena married Frederick, Duke of Bavaria (1339-93) and they were the parents of Elisabeth of Bavaria-Landshut who married Frederick I, Elector of Brandenburg (1371-1441) of the Brandenburg line of the Hohenzollerns.



#### Doría

The descent is from Valentina Doria daughter of Bernabò Doria and Eliana Fieschi. Valentina married Stefano Visconti (d.1327) and they were the parents of Bernabò Visconti, Lord of Milan (1323-85) who is mentioned above under Visconti.



#### Fieschi

The descent is from Eliana Fieschi who is mentioned above under Doria.



#### Campbell of Ardkinglass

The descent is from Jean Campbell daughter of Alexander Campbell, Bishop of Brechin (d.1608) who was a 3rd cousin (twice removed) of Archibald Campbell, 2<sup>nd</sup> Earl of Argyll. Jean married Sir John Hamilton of Lettrick who is mentioned above under

#### Counts of Schwarzburg

*The descent is from Günther VII*, *Count of Schwarzburg (d.*1274), *son of Henry II, Count of Schwarzburg-Blankenburg (d.*1236).



Günther VII was the father of Sophie of Schwarzburg (d.1279) who married Berthold V, Count of Henneberg-Schleusingen (d.1284).

One of their four greats granddaughters, Dorothea of Brandenburg (d.1495) married Christian I, King of Denmark.



Margraves of Lusatía

The descent is from Conrad II, Margrave of Lusatia (d.1210), son of Dedi (Dedo) III, Margrave of Lusatia (d.1190) and Matilda of Heinsberg. Conrad II married Elisabeth of Greater Poland, daughter of Mieszko III "the Old", Duke of Greater Poland (d.1201/02) and Elisabeth of Hungary, the daughter of Béla II, King of Hungary.



Dukes of Saxe-Wittenberg

The descent is from Barbara of Saxe-Wittenberg (1405-65), daughter of Rudolf III, Duke of Saxe-Wittenberg (d.1419).

There is more than one descent from this ducal line.



Lords and Dukes of Mecklenburg & Lords of Werle

The descent is from Ingeborg of Mecklenburg-Schwerin (d.1395), daughter of Albert II, Duke of Mecklenburg (d.1378/79) and Euphemia of Sweden (1317-70). Ingeborg married Henry II, Count of Holstein-Rendsburg and they were



the parents of Gerhard VI, Count of Holstein-Rendsburg (d.1404).

The arms of the Dukes of Mecklenburg in the  $14^{th}$  century are depicted at right.



The Lords of Werle were a cadet branch of the Lords of Mecklenburg descending from Henry Borwin II, Lord of Mecklenburg (1170-1226). There is descent from this branch from Sophia of Werle, daughter of Nicholas II, Lord of Werle (d.1315/16), a great-grandson of Henry Borwin II, Lord of Mecklenburg. The arms used by the Lords of Werle are depicted at left.



Counts of Andechs

The descent is from Berthold II, Count of Andechs (d.1151). Berthold II married Sophia of Carniola (d.1132) daughter of Poppo II, Margrave of Carniola (d.1098).

Berthold II and Sophia were the parents of Berthold I, Margarve of Istria (d.1188) who married Hedwig of

Wittelsbach (d.1174), she was the daughter of Otto IV, Count of Scheyern and Wittelsbach (d.1156) and Heilika of Pettendorf-Lengenfeld.

The Margrave of Istria and Dukes of Merania used the arms depicted at right. There is descent from this branch from Berthold IV, Duke of Merania (d.1204), he was a grandson of Berthold II mentioned above.





#### Counts of Henneberg

The descent is from Elisabeth of Henneberg (1318-77), daughter of Berthold VII, Count of Henneberg-Schleusingen (1272-1340) and Adelheid of Hesse. Elisabeth married John II, Burgrave of Nuremberg (d.1357) who was a member of the Hohenzollern family, one of the greatest sovereign dynasties of central Europe.



# Counts of Kyburg

The descent is from Anna of Kyburg daughter of Hartmann V, Count of Kyburg (d.1263) and Elisabeth de Châlon, daughter of Hugh, Count of Burgundy (1220-66). Anna married Eberhard I, Count of Habsburg-Laufenburg (d.1284).



#### Henry "the Lion" (Duke of Saxony and Bavaria)

These are the arms of Henry "the Lion", Duke of Saxony and Bavaria (d.1195). The descent is from three of his children, two of whom were with Matilda of England daughter of Henry II, namely: William of Winchester, Lord of Lüneburg (1184-1213) and Henry V, Count Palatine of the Rhine (d.1227). The other descent is from his illegitimate child with Ida of Blieskastel, Matilda who married

Henry Borwin I, Lord of Mecklenburg (d.1226/27), they were four greats grandparents of the Ingeborg of Mecklenburg-Schwerin mentioned above under Lords and Dukes of Mecklenburg.



## Counts of Anhalt

The descent is from Hedwig of Anhalt, daughter of Henry I, Count of Anhalt (d.1252). Hedwig married Boleslaw II Rogatka, Duke of Sroda Slaska (amongst other titles). He was the son of Henry II "the Pious", Duke of Poland (1196-1241) and Anna of Bohemia (d.1265), daughter of Ottokar I, King of Bohemia (d.1230) and Constance of Hungary (1181-1240).

The Princes of Anhalt-Bernburg used the arms depicted at right. There is descent from this branch through Catherine of Anhalt-Bernburg (d.1390), daughter of Bernhard III, Prince of Anhalt-Bernburg (d.1348). Catherine married Magnus II, Duke of Brunswick-Lüneburg (1324-73), mentioned below under the Dukes of Brunswick-Lüneburg.





Dukes of Brunswick-Lüneburg

The descent is from Catherine Elisabeth of Brunswick-Lüneburg, daughter of Magnus II, Duke of Brunswick-Lüneburg (1324-73) and Catherine of Anhalt-Bernburg (d.1390). Catherine married Gerhard VI, Count of Holstein-Rendsburg (d.1404) who is mentioned above under the Lords and Dukes of Mecklenburg.

There is also a descent from the sister of Magnus II, Sophie of Brunswick-Lüneburg (see below under the Counts of Honstein).



#### Dukes of Pomeranía

The descent is from Margaret Sambiria (d.1282), daughter of Sambor II, Duke of Pomerania (d.1277/78) and Matilda of Mecklenburg, daughter of Henry Borwin II, Lord of Mecklenburg (1170-1226). Margaret married Christopher I, King of Denmark (1219-59) and they were the parents of Eric V, King of Denmark (1249-86).



and Agnes of Rochlitz (d.1195).

#### High Dukes of Poland

The descent is from Henry II "the Pious", Duke of Poland (1196-1241) who is mentioned above under the Counts of Anhalt. He was the son of Henry "the Bearded", Duke of Poland (d.1237/38) and Saint Hedwig of Silesia (Andechs) (d.1243), daughter of Berthold IV, Duke of Merania (d.1204) Emperor of Nicaea

The descent is from Maria Laskarina (d.1270), daughter of Theodore I Laskaris, Emperor of Nicaea (d.1222) and Anna Komnene Angelina (d.1212). Maria married Béla IV, King of Hungary & Croatia (1206-70) and they were the parents of Stephen V, King of Hungary & Croatia (1239-72).

Margarves of Brandenburg

While there are multiple descents, one descent is from Dorothea of Brandenburg (d.1495), daughter of John, Margrave of Brandenburg-Kulmbach (1406-64) and Barbara of Saxe-Wittenberg (1405-65) [mentioned above under the Dukes of Saxe-Wittenberg]. Dorothea married

Christian I, King of Denmark (1426-81).

The Margraves of Brandenburg-Kulmbach used the arms depicted at right.



Dukes of Bavaría


The descent is from Elisabeth of Bavaria-Landshut (1383-1442), daughter of Frederick, Duke of Bavaria (1339-93) and Maddalena Visconti (1366-1404) [mentioned above under Visconti - Lords of Milan]. Elisabeth married the Hohenzollern Frederick I, Elector of Brandenburg (1371-1440).



#### Landgraves of Hesse

The descent is from Adelheid of Hesse, daughter of Henry I, Landgrave of Hesse (1244-1308). Adelheid married Berthold VII, Count of Henneberg-Schleusingen (1272-1340), mentioned above under the Counts of Henneberg. The Landgraves of Hesse were descended from the Landgraves of Thuringia and used the same arms.

There is also a descent from Sophie of Hesse (another daughter of Henry I), see the Counts of Waldeck below.








### Counts of Lindow-Ruppin

The descent is from Sophia of Lindow-Ruppin, daughter of Günther, Count of Lindow-Ruppin. Sophia married John I, Lord of Werle-Parchim (d.1283) and they were the parents of Nicholas II, Lord of Werle (d.1315/16) mentioned above under the Lords and Dukes of Mecklenburg & Lords of Werle.



# Counts of Hohenberg

The descent is from Burkhard III, Count of Hohenberg (d.1253) son of Burkhard II, Count of Hohenberg. Burkhard III married Matilda of Tübingen and they were the parents of Gertrude of Zollern-Hohenberg-Haigerloch who married Rudolf I, King of Germany & Count of Habsburg (mentioned above under Habsburg).




#### Della Scala (Lords of Verona)

The descent is from Beatrice Regina della Scala (1331-84), daughter of Mastino II della Scala, Lord of Verona (1308-51). Beatrice married Bernabò Viscontí, Lord of Milan (1323-85) who is mentioned above under Viscontí (Lords of Milan).




#### Prínces of Rügen

#### Counts of Holstein

The descent is from Helvig of Schauenburg (d.1436), daughter of Gerhard VI, Count of Holstein-Rendsburg (d.1404) and Catherine Elisabeth of Brunswick-Lüneburg. Helvig married Dietrich (Theodoric), Count of Oldenburg (d.1439/40), they were the parents of Christian I, King of Denmark (1426-81). See also above under the Counts of Oldenburg.



# Count of Tecklenburg

Dukes of Austria (Babenberg)

The descent is from Oda of Tecklenburg, daughter of Simon I, Count of Tecklenburg (d.1202) and Oda of Berg-Altena (d.1224). Oda married Herman II, Lord of Lippe (now Lippstadt) (1175-1229).

The descent is from Agnes of Austria (d.1226) and Constance of Babenberg (1212-1243), both daughters of Leopold VI, Duke of Austria (1176-1230) and Theodora Angelina (d.1246), daughter of

Isaac II Angelos, Byzantíne Emperor (1156-1204). Agnes married Albert I, Duke of Saxony, Angría & Westphalía (d.1260) and Constance married Henry III, Margrave of




Meíssen (d.1287/88).



Dukes & Counts of Cleves


The descent is from Catherine of Cleves (1417-1478/79), daughter of Adolph I, Duke of Cleves (1373-1448) and Marie of Burgundy (1400-66), daughter of John "the Fearless", Duke of Burgundy (1371-1419).

Catherine of Cleves married Arnold of Egmond, Duke of Guelders (1410-1472/73). They were the maternal grandparents of James III, King of Scotland (1451-88).



#### da Carrara (Counts of Padua)

The descent is from Cecilia of Carrara (d.1435), daughter of Francesco I da Carrara, Count of Padua (1325-93). Cecilia married Wenceslaus I, Duke of Saxe-Wittenberg (d.1388). They were great grandparents of Dorothea of Brandenburg (d.1495) who married Christian I, King of Denmark.



*Livingstone of Callendar (Earls of Callendar from 1641)* 

The descent is from Janet Livingstone, daughter of Sir Alexander Livingstone of Callendar, Stirlingshire (d.1451). He was Justiciar of Scotland and keeper of Stirling Castle.

He conspired with William Crichton, the Lord Chancellor, in the assassination of the 6th Earl of Douglas and his brother (known as the "Black Dinner") at Edinburgh Castle. Later he allied with the Douglases against Crichton.

Janet Livingstone married Sir James Hamilton, 5th of Cadzow.



#### Counts of Honstein & Klettenberg

The descent is from Agnes von Honstein (d.1404), daughter of Dietrich V, Count of Honstein (d.1379) and Sophie of Brunswick-Lüneburg. Agnes married Christian V, Count of Oldenburg (d.aft.6 April 1399). The original arms of the Counts of Honstein are depicted at right.





#### Counts of Waldeck

The descent is from Elisabeth von Waldeck (d.1371), daughter of Otto I, Count of Waldeck (d.1305) and Sophie of Hesse. Elisabeth married Dietrich III, Count of Honstein-Klettenberg and they were the parents of Dietrich V mentioned above under the Counts of Honstein & Klettenberg.



#### Margarves of Montferrat

The descent is from Adelheid of Montferrat (d.1284/85), daughter of Boniface II, Marquess of Montferrat (1202-53). Adelheid married Albert I, Duke of Brunswick-Lüneburg (d.1279), a great grandfather of Magnus II, Duke of Brunswick-Lüneburg (referred to above under the Dukes of Brunswick-Lüneburg).

The arms of the Margraves of Montferrat are more or less identical to the Scottish arms of Menzies (of that Ilk), although there is no connection between the two families.



Counts of Tyrol

The descent is from Adelaide of Tyrol, daughter of Albert IV, Count of Tyrol (d.1253). Adelaide married Meinhard I, Count of Gorizia-Tyrol (d.1258).

Counts of Gorízia

*The descent is from Meinhard I, Count of Gorizia-Tyrol* (*d.*1258) *who is mentioned above under the Counts of Tyrol.* 

Meinhard I was the son of Engelbert III, Count of Gorízia (d.1220) and Matilda of Andechs, Countess of Písino (d.1245).






#### Dukes of Brittany

The descent is from Blanche of Brittany (1271-1327), daughter of John II, Duke of Brittany & Earl of Richmond (1239-1305) and Beatrice of England (1242-74/75), daughter of Henry III, King of England. Blanche married Philip of Artois (1269-98).



#### Counts of Nevers

The descent is from Louis I, Count of Nevers (1272-1322), son of Robert III, Count of Flanders (1249-1322) and Yolande II, Countess of Nevers (1247-80). Louis I married Joan, Countess of Rethel (d.1328), daughter of Hugh IV, Count of Rethel (1244-85) and Isabella of Grandpré.



#### *Counts of the Mark (or Marck)*

The descent is from Adolf III, Count of Marck (d.1394), son of Adolf II, Count of Marck (d.1347) and Margarte of Cleves. Adolf III married Margaret of Jülich (d.1425) and they were the parents of Adolf I, Duke of Cleves (1373-1448).




# Counts of Ravensberg

The descent is from Margaret of Ravensberg, daughter of Otto IV, Count of Ravensberg (d.1328) and Margaret of Berg-Windeck. Margaret married Gerhard VI, Count of Berg & Ravensberg (d.1360) and they were the maternal grandparents of Adolf I, Duke of Cleves (1373-1448).



# Counts of Arnsberg

The descent is from Sophie of Cuijck-Arnsberg, daughter of Gottfried II, Count of Arnsberg. Sophie married Bernard III, Lord of Lippe (c.1194-1265) and they were the parents of Hedwig of Lippe who married Otto III, Count of Ravensberg, the paternal grandparents of Margaret of Ravensberg (mentioned above).



## Lords of Lippe

The descent is from Hedwig of Lippe, daughter of Bernard III, Lord of Lippe (c.1194-1265) and Sophie of Cuijck-Arnsberg (mentioned above under the Counts of Arnsberg). Hedwig of Lippe married Otto III, Count of Ravensberg.



# Counts of Rethel

The descent is from Joan, Countess of Rethel (d.1328), daughter of Hugh IV, Count of Rethel (1244-85) and Isabella of Grandpré. Joan married Louis I, Count of Nevers (1272-1322), who is mentioned above under the Counts of Nevers.



#### Counts of Grandpré

The descent is from Isabella of Grandpré (mentioned above under the Counts of Rethel). Isabella was the daughter of Henry V, Count of Grandpré (d. Aft. 7 Apríl 1287) and Isabeau de Brienne. Isabella married Hugh IV, Count of Rethel (1244-85).



#### Counts of Blois

The descent is from Margaret, Countess of Blois (d.1230), daughter of Theobald V, Count of Blois (1130-90/91) and Alix of France (1150-1197/98), daughter of Louis VII, King of France and Eleanore of Aquitaine (1122-1204). Margaret married Otto I, Count of Burgundy (d.1199/1200).



#### Barons of Donzy

The descent is from Agnès II of Donzy (d.1224), daughter of Hervé IV de Donzy, Count of Nevers (1173-1221/22) and Mathilde de Courtenay, daughter of Peter II de Courtenay, Emperor of Constantinople (d.1219). Agnès married Guy III de Châtillon, Count of Saínt-Pol (1196-1226).



#### Dukes of Glogów

The descent is from Henry III, Duke of Glogów (d.1309), son of Konrad I, Duke of Glogów and Salome of Greater Poland. Henry III married Matilda of Brunswick-Lüneburg (1276-1318). Catherine Elisabeth of Brunswick-Lüneburg (mentioned above under the Dukes of Brunswick-Lüneburg), was a greatgrandniece of Matilda of Brunswick-Lüneburg.




# Grand Duke of Lithuania

The descent is from Elisabeth (Elzbieta) of Lithuania (d.1364), daughter of Gediminas, Grand Duke of Lithuania (d.1341). Elisabeth married Wenceslaus, Duke of Plock (d.1336) whose maternal grandfather was Ottokar II, King of Bohemia (d.1278).



#### Earls of Kent

The descent is from Margaret Holland (1385-1439), daughter of Thomas Holland, 2nd Earl of Kent (d.1397) and Alice Fitzalan (d.1415/16). Margaret married John Beaufort, 1st Earl of Somerset (1373-1410), a paternal grandson of Edward III, King of England. Margaret Holland's daughter Joan Beaufort (1404-45) became Queen of Scotland on her marriage to James I, King of Scotland.



## Lords of Arkel

The descent is from Maria van Arkel, daughter of John V van Arkel, Lord of Arkel (1362-1428) and Joanna of Jülich (d.1394). Maria married John II, Lord of Egmond (d.1450/51).



#### Dukes of Lorraine

The descent is from Isabelle of Lorraine (d.1353), daughter of Theobald II, Duke of Lorraine (1263-1312). Isabelle married Érard de Bar, Seigneur de Pierrepont (d.1337).



## Dukes of Limburg

The descent is from Henry IV, Duke of Limburg (1195-1246/47) and his sister, Mathilde of Limburg, both children of Waleran III, Duke of Limburg (d.1226) and Cunigunda of Lorraine. Henry IV married Irmgard of Berg (d.1248/49) and Mathilde married William III, Count of Jülich (d.1219 in the 5<sup>th</sup> Crusade).



#### Lords of Egmond

The descent is from John II, Lord of Egmond (d.1450/51), son of Arnold I, Lord of Egmond (d.1409) and Jolanthe of Leiningen (d.1434). John II married Maria van Arkel (mentioned above under the Lords of Arkel).



# Dukes of Guelders

The descent is from Mary of Guelders (d.1463), daughter of Arnold of Egmond, Duke of Guelders (1410-72/73), who was the son of John II, Lord of Egmond (mentioned above under the Lords of Egmond). Mary's mother was Catherine of Cleves (1417-78/79) Mary married James II, King of Scotland (1430-60).



## Counts of Leiningen-Dagsburg

The descent is from Jolanthe of Leiningen, daughter of Frederick VIII of Leiningen-Dagsburg (1320-87) and Jolanda of Jülich. Jolanthe married Arnold I, Lord of Egmond (d.1409) and they were the parets of John II, Lord of Egmond (mentioned above under the Lords of Egmond.



# Counts of Jülich

The descent is from Jolanda of Jülich (mentioned above under the Counts of Leiningen-Dagsburg). She was the daughter of Gottfried, Count of Jülich & Lord of Bergheim (d.1335) and Elisabeth of Cleves. Jolanda married Frederick VIII of Leiningen-Dagsburg (1320-87).



#### House of Díllingen

The descent is from Hartmann III of Dillingen (d.1180) and his wife Richinza of Lenzburg. They were great grandparents of Rudolf I, King of Germany and Count of Habsburg (1218-91).



#### Dukes of Zähríngen

The descent is from Anna of Zähringen, daughter of Berthold IV, Duke of Zähringen (d.1186). Anna married Ulric, Count of Kyburg (d.1227). They were the maternal grandparents of Rudolf I, King of Germany & Count of Habsburg (1218-91).



#### MacDonald (Lords of the Isles)

There is a descent from Mary MacDonald, daughter of Angus "Og" MacDonald, Lord of the Isles (d.1330). Mary married William de Ross, 5th Earl of Ross (d.1371/72).

*There is another descent from Mariota of the Isles, daughter of Donald, Lord of the Isles (d.1423) and Margaret (or Mary) Leslie, Countess of Ross (a granddaughter of Mary MacDonald).*  The arms of the Lords of the Isles are very similar to the Dukes of Zähringen, but the two families are of course distinct, the Dukes of Zähringen being German and the Lords of the Isles of Scottish and Scandinavian descent.



#### Maudít (Lord Hanslape)

The descent is from Isabel Mauduit (or Maudit), daughter of William de Maudit, Lord Hanslape (d.c.1256) and Alice de Beaumont, daughter of Waleran de Beaumont, 4th Earl of Warwick. Isabel married William de Beauchamp, Lord Elmley and they were the parents of William de Beauchamp, 9th Earl of Warwick.



#### de Verdun (or Verdon)

The descent is from Maud de Verdon (d.1283), daughter of Theobald le Botiller (d.1230) and Rohese de Verdon. Maude married John Fitzalan, 6th Earl of Arundel (1223-67).



#### The Counts of Hoya

The descent is from Richeza of Hoya-Stumpenhausen, daughter of Henry II, Count of Hoya (d.1290). Richeza married John I, Count of Oldenburg and they were 3 greats grandparents of Dietrich, Count of Oldenburg mentioned above under the Counts of Oldenburg.




#### de Brienne (Seigneur de Ramerupt)

The descent is from Isabeau de Brienne, daughter of Érard de Brienne, Seigneur de Ramerupt (d.1246) and Philippa of Champagne (1195-1250), Phillippa was the daughter of Henry II, Count of Champagne (1166-97) and Isabella I of Jerusalem (1172-1205). Isabeau married Henry V, Count of Grandpré (d.c.1287).



#### Counts of Châlon

The descent is from John, Count of Châlon (d.1267), son of Stephen III, Count of Auxonne (d.1241) and Beatrix, Countess of Châlon. John married Mahaud (or Mahaut) of Burgundy (d.1242), daughter of Hugh III, Duke of Burgundy (1142-92) and Béatrice of Albon (1161-1228).




Counts of Saint-Pol

The descent is from Guy III de Châtillon, Count of Saint-Pol (1196-1226), son of Gaucher III de Châtillon, Count of Saint-Pol (d.1219) and Élisabeth de Campdavain, Countess of Saint-Pol (in her own right, having inherited the title from her father, Hughes IV, the arms of Campdavain are depicted at right). Guy III




de Châtillon married Agnès II of Donzy (d.1224), who is mentioned above under the Barons of Donzy.



Counts of Roucy

The descent is from Ade de Roucy, daughter of Hugues, Count of Roucy and Aveline de Pierrefonds. Ade married Gaucher II de Châtillon, Châtelain of Châtillon (d.1148), they were great grandparents of Guy III de Châtillon, Count of Saint-Pol (1196-1226) who is mentioned above under the Counts of Saint-Pol.




Gradenigo (Doges of Venice)

The descent is from Anna Gradenigo (d.1321), daughter of Pietro Gradenigo, Doge of Venice (1251-1311) and Tomasina Morosini. Anna married Jacopo I da Carrara (1264-1324).



#### Morosíní

The descent is from Tomasina Morosini (mentioned above under Gradenigo), daughter of Michele Sbarra Morosini and husband of Pietro Gradenigo, Doge of Venice (1251-1311).



#### Sinclair (or St. Clair) of Hermanston

The descent is from Marion (Mariota) Sinclair, daughter of Sir John Sinclair (d.c.1470) of Hermanston and Polwarth. Marion married George Ker of Samuelston.



#### de Laval (Seígneur de Laval)

The descent is from Emma de Laval (d.1264), daughter of Guy V de Laval, Seigneur de Laval (d.1210) and Avoise de Craon. Emma married Jean de Toucy (d.1250).



#### de Craon (Seígneur de Craon)

The descent is from Avoise de Craon (mentioned above under de Laval). Avoise was the daughter of Maurice II de Craon, Seigneur de Craon (d.1196) and Isabelle de Meulan (d.1220). Isabelle de Meulan was the daughter of Waleran de Beaumont, 1st Earl of Worcester (1104-66) and Agnes de Montfort.



#### Connor of Bandon (Cork, Ireland)

The descent is from Elizabeth Connor, daughter of Daniel Connor (d.1761) and Margaret Slone. Elizabeth married Richard Gumbleton (1721-76) of Castle Richard, County Waterford in 1743 and they were the parents of the Mary Gumbleton mentioned above under Gumbleton.


The coat of arms depicted at left was given in *Burke's Irish Family Records*, 1976, page 267 for the descendants of Daniel Connor of Bandon who married Margaret Slone in 1698. Daniel's parents were Cornelius Connor and Joan Splane who married in 1670.

Somerville of Carnwath (Lords Somerville from 1445)

The descent is from Elizabeth Somerville, daughter of John Somerville, 3rd Lord Somerville. Elizabeth married Archibald (Celestin) Campbell of Lochow and they were the parents of Colin Campbell, 1st Earl of Argyll (d.1493).



## Clephane of Carslogie, Fifeshire

The descent is from Helen Clephane (d.1608), daughter of George Clephane (d.1557) and Christian Learmonth. Helen married Alexander Campbell of Carco (d.1608), Bishop of Brechin and they were the parents of the Jean Campbell who married Sir John Hamilton of Lettrick (mentioned above under Hamilton).



#### Learmonth

The descent is from Christian Learmonth, daughter of Thomas Learmonth. Christian married George Clephane (d.1557) of Carslogie, Fifeshire and they were the parents of Helen Clephane who is mentioned above under Clephane.




#### Meldrum of Seggie

The descent is from Grissel Meldrum (d.1597), daughter of Alexander Meldrum of Seggie and Euphame Boswell. Grissel married James Learmonth (d.1547 in the Battle of Pinkie) and they were the parents of Thomas Learmonth who is mentioned above under Learmonth.



#### Cunningham of Caprington

The descent is from Elizabeth Cunningham, daughter of Adam Cunningham, 2nd of Caprington. Elizabeth married James Makgill and they were great grandparents of the Elizabeth Makgill mentioned above under Makgill.




Graham (inter alia Lords Graham from 1445, Earls of Montrose from 1503 and Dukes of Montrose from 1707)

The descent is from Janet Graham, daughter of Patrick Graham of Inchbrakie (d.1536) and Margaret Stewart (a great granddaughter of James II of Scotland).

Patrick Graham of Inchbrakie was the son of William Graham, 1st Earl of Montrose (d.1513) and Christian Wawane.

Janet married Dougald Campbell of Ardailtoun and they were the parents of Alexander Campbell (mentioned above under Clephane and Campbell of Ardkinglass).



Stewart, Duke of Albany (2<sup>nd</sup> Creation by James II of Scotland)

The descent is from Margaret Stewart, daughter of Alexander Stewart, Bishop of Moray (d.1537). Alexander Stewart was the son of Alexander Stewart, Duke of Albany (d.1485), a son of James II, King of Scotland.

Margaret Stewart married Patrick Graham of Inchbrakie (mentioned above under Graham).



Counts of Schwalenberg

The descent is from Adolf I, Count of Waldeck and Schwalenberg (d.1270), son of Heinrich I, Count of Waldeck and Schwalenberg (d.1214) and Heseke von Dassel (d.1220).

Adolf I was a great grandfather of Elisabeth von Waldeck (d.1371), who is mentioned above under the Counts of Waldeck.

Adolf I is an ancestor of Christian I, King of Denmark and James IV, King of Scotland.



de Essex (Lord Rayleigh & Haughley)

The descent is from Agnes de Essex, daughter of Henry of Essex (d.c.1170) and Alice de Montfort. Agnes was the 3<sup>rd</sup> wife of Aubrey de Vere, 1st Earl of Oxford (d.1194). According to Wikipedia, many have mistakenly called Agnes "Lucia". This mistake is

based on a misreading of a single document associated with a religious house at Hedingham, Essex, established around 1190. A woman named Lucia was prioress at Castle Hedingham Priory and has been confused with Agnes.

#### Denniston of Denniston (or Danielston)

The descent is from Elizabeth Denniston, daughter of Sir Robert Denniston. Elizabeth married Sir Robert Maxwell of Calderwood and they were the parents of Mariot (Mariota) Maxwell who married Robert Boyd, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Boyd (d.1481-82). Mariot and Robert Boyd were the grandparents of Margaret Boyd of Bonshaw, mistress of James IV of Scotland.



#### Maxwell of Calderwood

The descent is from Mariot (Mariota) Maxwell who is mentioned above under Denniston. Mariot's father, Sir Robert Maxwell of Calderwood quartered his arms with those of Denniston.

The original Denniston arms were recorded by Nisbet as being a bend sable, however they were quartered here as a bend azure.



#### Erskine (Lords of Erskine and de jure Earls of Mar)

The descent is from Christian Erskine, daughter of Sir Robert Erskine, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Erskine and Elizabeth Lindsay (daughter of Sir David Lindsay, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Crawford mentioned above). Christian Erskine married Patrick Graham, 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Graham (d.1465). Their grandson was William Graham, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Montrose who died at the Battle of Flodden in 1513.



# The Scottish Royal Family

There are multiple descents. In total there are descents from 16 Kings of Scotland.

The most recent descent is from James IV (1473-1513) through his illegitimate daughter, Katherine Stewart by Marion (Margaret) Boyd of Bonshaw. Katherine married James Douglas, 3rd Earl of Morton. Please see the tree at the end of this document for this descent.

*Two descents are from Princess Mary, daughter of Robert III (1337-1406). She married (amongst others), Sir James* 

Kennedy (The Younger) of Dunure. Their 5 greats granddaughter, Margaret Kennedy married Sir Patrick Agnew, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of Lochnaw (d.1661).

Princess Mary also married William Edmonstone (d. 1460). Their great granddaughter was Elizabeth Edmonstone who married John Montgomerie (d. 30 April 1520), son of Hugh Montgomerie, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Eglinton. (Please see the tree below for these descents from Princess Mary).

There is also descent from King William, "The Lion" (d.1214). His daughter, Ada FitzWilliam (d.1200) married Patrick, Earl of Dunbar (1152-1232), the 9 greats grandfather of Margaret Dunbar mentioned above under Dunbar.

There is also descent from Donald III (1033-1099) through his granddaughter, Hextilda, who married Richard Comyn of Northallerton, Yorkshire (d. Bet. 1176 – 1182). Hextilda and Richard Comyn were the grandparents of Elizabeth Comyn and Alexander Comyn, Earl of Buchan (mentioned above under Comyn).



# The English Royal Family

There are multiple descents from the English Royal Family. There are descents from seven pre-conquest kings and nine post-conquest kings, the last of whom was Edward III (1312-77). The descent from Edward III is through his son, John of Gaunt, 1<sup>st</sup> Duke of Lancaster and John's son, John Beaufort, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Somerset (1373-1410). A table showing this specific descent is available at:

www.staigfamily.wordpress.com. This table shows the descent

through Joan Beaufort's marriage to James Stewart "the Black Knight of Lorn", but there is also a descent from her marriage to James I, King of Scotland through to James IV, King of Scotland. There is also a descent from Robert of Caen, Earl of Gloucester (d.1147), an illegitimate son of Henry I.

There are also multiple descents from the Dukes of Normandy, not only from William the Conqueror, (d.1087) but also his sister, Adelaide of Normandy, Countess of Aumale (who married Lambert II, Count of Lens).

There is descent from Richard I, Duke of Normandy (933-996), not only through the senior line, but also illegitimately through Godfrey, Count of Eu, the grandfather of Richard FitzGilbert, Lord of Clare. There is also descent from Richard I's son Robert II (Archbishop of Rouen) who was the grandfather of Agnes d'Évreux who married Simon de Montfort\* of Montfort-l'Amaury, who in turn were great grandparents of Bertrade de Montfort mentioned above under de Montfort.

Mathilda of Flanders (William the Conqueror's wife) was a 5 greats granddaughter of Alfred the Great (849-899). She was also an 8 greats granddaughter of Charlemagne (742-813/14).

\* Not to be confused with Simon de Montfort,  $6^{th}$  Earl of Leicester, his much more famous descendant.



# The French Royal Famíly

Commencing with Louis IV (920-954), there is descent from 13 kings of France, the last of whom was John II (1319-64). Our descent is from John II's son, Philip the Bold, Duke of Burgundy (d.1404).

The other kings from whom there is descent are: Louis VI, Louis VII, Louis VIII, Louis IX, Philip I, Philip II, Philip III, Philip IV, Philip V, Philip VI and Henry I.



# The Hungarian Royal Family

There is descent from 10 kings of Hungary, the last of whom was Stephen V, King of Hungary and Croatia (d.1272). Stephen's daughter, Maria of Hungary (d.1323) married Charles II, King of Naples and Albania (1254-1309).



# The Royal Family of Castile and León

*There is descent from eight kings of Castile and León and one queen (i.e. either Castile, León or Castile and León). The last of these kings* 

was Ferdinand III, King of Castile (d.1252). Ferdinand's daughter, Eleanore of Castile (1241-90) married Edward I, King of England.



# The Royal Famíly of Aragon

There is descent from seven kings of Aragon and one queen, the last king from whom there was descent was Peter III (1239-1285). Peter III's son was Frederick III, King of Sicily (1272-1337).



## The Royal Famíly of Navarre

There is descent from five kings of Navarre and four kings of Pamplona (Navarre's predecessor). The last king of Navarre from whom there is descent was Henry I (d.1274). Henry's daughter, Joan of Navarre (1272/73-1305) married King Philip IV of France.



#### The Kings of Naples and Sicily

There is descent from Charles I, King of Naples and Sicily (1226/27-1284/85) and Charles II, King of Naples and Albania (1254-1309). Charles I had made a claim to Jerusalem (hence the arms depicted on the sinister side of his armorial bearings). Charles II's daughter,



Margaret, Countess of Anjou was the mother of King Philip VI of France (from whom we descend), we also descend from her daughter Joan of Valois (1294-1342) who married William I, Count of Hainaut (d.1337). Philippa of Hainaut (mentioned above under the Counts of Hainaut and Holland) was their daughter.

There is also descent from the Hohenstaufen Kings of Sicily (arms depicted at right), through Elisabeth of Sicily (1310-49), daughter of Frederick III, King of Sicily (1272-1337). Frederick III inherited the throne of Sicily through his mother, Constance of Sicily (1249-1302), the daughter of Manfred, King of Sicily (1232-1265/66) who was killed in the Battle of Benevento where he was defeated by Charles I (mentioned above).



#### The Polish Royal Family

The descent is from Mieszko II Lambert, King of Poland (d.1034). There is descent from his daughter Richeza (or Adelaide) of Poland (1013-75) who married Béla I, King of Hungary. There is also descent from his son, Casimir I "the restorer", Duke of Poland (1016-58) who married Maria Dobroniega of Kiev (d.1087), the daughter of Vladimir Sviatoslavich "The Great". The arms depicted date from 1295.



## The Swedish Royal Family

There is descent from 10 kings of Sweden, the last of whom was Valdemar I (1239-1302). He married Sophia of Denmark, daughter of Eric IV, King of Denmark (d.1250) and Jutta of Saxony. Valdermar I's daughter, Ingeborg of Sweden (1263-92) married Gerhard II, Count of Holstein-Plön (1254-1312).



The arms depicted at right are the arms used by the House of Bjelbo to which Valdemar I belonged.

# The Norwegian Royal Family

There is descent from seven kings of Norway the last of whom was HaakonV (1270-1319). Haakon V's daughter, Ingeborg of Norway (1301-61) married Eric Magnusson, Duke of Södermanland (1282-1318) and their daughter was Euphemia of Sweden (1317-70) who is referred to above under the Lords and Dukes of Mecklenburg as the wife of Albert II, Duke of Mecklenburg (d.1378/79).



# The Danish Royal Family

There is descent from 14 kings of Denmark the last of whom was Christian I (1426-81). Christian I was the son of Dietrich (Theodoric), Count of Oldenburg (d.1439/40) and Helvig of Schauenburg (d.1436). He married Dorothea of Brandenburg (d.1495) who is mentioned above under the Margarves of Brandenburg.



# The Bohemian Royal Family (Premyslid Dynasty)

There is descent from seven kings of Bohemia the last of whom was John "the Blind", King of Bohemia (1296-1346) who was famously killed by the English at the Battle of Crécy. John married



Elisabeth of Bohemia (d.1330), daughter of Wenceslaus II, King of Bohemia & Poland (1271-1305).



# The Royal Family of Savoy

The descent is from Beatrice of Savoy, daughter of Amadeus IV, Count of Savoy (1197-1253) and Marguerite of Burgundy (1192-1243). Beatrice married Manfred III, 3<sup>rd</sup> Margarve of Saluzzo (d.1244). Thomas I, Count of Savoy (mentioned above under the Counts of Geneva) was the grandfather of Beatrice of Savoy.

The House of Savoy ultimately occupied the thrones of Cyprus, Sicily, Sardinia and Italy.



# House of Hohenstaufen (Dukes of Swabía, Holy Roman Emporers, Kíngs of the Germans)

There are multiple descents from this house. One descent is from Marie of Swabia (1201-35), daughter of Philip of Swabia, King of the Germans (1177-1208) and his wife Irene Angelina (d.1208), daughter of the Byzantine Emperor, Isaac II Angelos (1156-1204).

Marie married Henry II, Duke of Brabant (1207-48).



# House of Habsburg (Holy Roman Emperors)


There are multiple descents from this house. One descent is from Rudolf I, King of Germany & Count of Habsburg (1218-91). He married Gertrude of Zollern-Hohenberg-Haigerloch (d.1280/81). There is descent from three of their daughters: Matilda (d.1304), Agnes (d.1322) and Jutta (d.1297), as well as their son, Albert I, King of Germany (1255-1308).



#### The Royal Family of Portugal

The descent is from Berengaria of Portugal (d.1221), daughter of Sancho I, King of Portugal (1154-1211) and Dulcia, daughter of Ramon Berenguer IV, Count of Barcelona (d.1162) and Petronilla Queen of Aragon (d.1173). Berengaria married Valdemar II, King of Denmark (1170-1241) and they were the parents of three kings of

Denmark (Eric IV, Abel and Christopher I).



# The Kings of Jerusalem

The descent is from Isabella I of Jerusalem (1172-1205), daughter of Amalric, King of Jerusalem (1136-74) and Maria Komnene, Queen of Jerusalem. Isabella I married Henry II, Count of Champagne (1166-97).



# Arms of Stewart of Garlies and some of its Cadet Branches



The above cadets (numbers 92 – 101) are all descended from Sir John Stewart of Garlies and his wife Marion Stewart (daughter of Sir Walter Stewart of Dalswinton, a great grandson of Sir John Stewart of Bonkyl who died 22 July 1298).

Stewart of Garlies and its cadets are distinguished (heraldically) from other branches of the Stewart family through the use of a bend engrailed gules (a red stripe with serrated edges running from the top left to bottom right of the shield). The use of the double tressure flory counter-flory is often used to indicate descent from the Scottish Royal Family. This family, originally known as the Stewarts of Garlies, is a younger branch of the Stewarts of Darnley, ancestors of the Earls and Dukes of Lennox, King James VI., and the later Royal Stewarts. They descend from Sir Alan Stewart, second son of the above Sir John Stewart so often alluded to, and from them sprang many well-known families in Scotland and Ireland, e.g., the Lords Blantyre, Mountjoy, and Blessinton, the Marquis of Londonderry, the Stewarts of Minto, the Baronets of Fort Stewart, the Stewarts of Fintalloch, Shambellic, Physgill, Glasserton, Hezilside, etc.— J.
